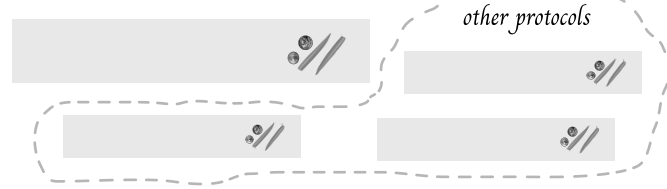

## 4 Domain name

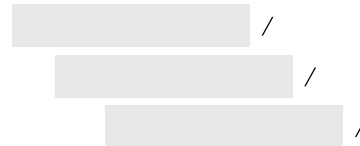
Our collective domain

## 5 URL path

This is usually the path to your website on a server, which can be thought  
of as similar to folders and files on your computer. On an irl-url  
connection, this path can take on various forms, such as experiences,  
memories, emotions, and senses.

Query strings are all about questioning and searching. What are you trying

## 7 Anchors

Anchors allow us to jump directly to parts of  
a page. Think of them like portals that  
transport you to different sections within a  
single page.

In irl-url space, anchors could represent  
significant signs, events, or breakthroughs in  
our lives that we've experienced...

Anchors always begin with a hash (#)

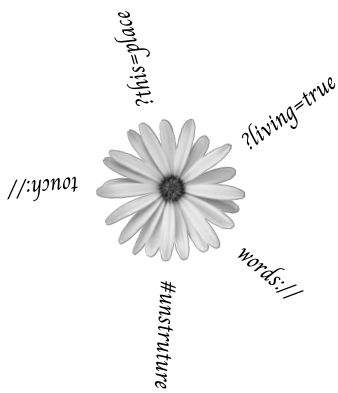

an irl-url is made up of fragments. Each fragment is alive with meaning and has complex relationships to other fragments. the sum of these pieces act as our guide, pointing us places, usually to servers ... but in irl-url space ... we use our senses to connect these fragments

an irl-url is made up of our thoughts, emotions, senses.

sometimes their relationships to one another can be abstract.

understanding might slowly come into being over time.



as a medium, urls are malleable. they can be configured endlessly

we keep the url alive through writing, movement, or in our memories

often urls are carriers of information. we construct and deconstruct them for an end result but rarely are they presented as they are.

urls are a medium that thrives on change and movement

irl-urls are temporary, forgetting is a feature

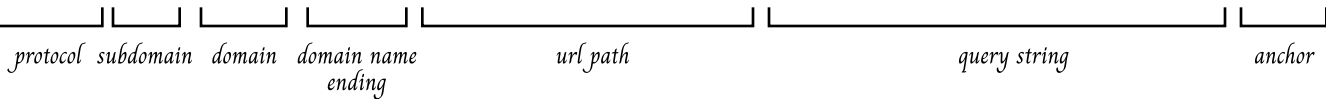
